I want to share with you why this change was made as well as the process for our making it.

As you may remember, we conducted an eight month strategic planning process that included hundreds of in-depth interviews with anyone who wished to be heard and several days of open discernment and discussion. Our purpose statement arose from this process and there was general acceptance and appreciation for it. However, even early on there were some concerns about the first line (“Reaching out to people who have given up on religion”).

Because this came through the collective discernment of the strategic planning process, this first line remained for over a year. But during that time we continued to hear some of you saying that you felt it sounded negative. Many said that “giving up” was a negative concept and should not begin something as important as our purpose statement.

As is our practice in considering make such a significant change, the staff first discussed the possibility of dropping this line. When they agreed, it was then taken to our Ministry Team Leaders for discussion. This is a group of about twenty, and it includes everyone that leads a ministry team, such as the head ushers for all three services, the facilities ministry leader, Garden Posse leader as well as many others. They, too, felt that this line should be removed.

Finally, our Board of Trustees discussed and agreed to the change and so, henceforth, our Purpose Statement will reflect only the two lines above.

Life is a process of awakening. In fact, the word “enlightenment” means “to awaken.” So, as we awaken to our oneness with a God that is affirming, we begin to see all of God’s creation in a more positive light. This shift in our consciousness spreads to those around us and the world begins to take on what Jesus referred to as “the kingdom of God.” As we carry this awareness into all of our interactions by living our oneness with this loving God, we become conduits of hope and love for others.

Our very lives then become an outreach to others. How we live becomes an example of a theology that transcends any religion and embraces all.

Let 2010 be a year of your deepening in your understanding that you are one with the creative, loving, supportive universe that we call God.

***"We have flown the air like birds and swum the sea like fishes,
but have yet to learn the simple act
of walking the earth like brothers."***

--Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The recent holiday honoring the remarkable teacher, minister and civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr., has prompted me to revisit the teachings and legacy of this great man. Dr. King's legacy in addressing powerful issues related to dignity, justice and love for all, and his commitment to peaceful change inspires me beyond words. I learn from him because I'm open to discovering where his words and example can lead me to a greater way of being.

As I read the words in the quote above I am filled with new hope. These words are not an admonishment of what I'm not doing, but rather, they're an invitation for me to dig more deeply into myself. They call me to look honestly into where I have yet to grow in my walk with others.

So, I think about these words again. I am appreciative of all the great outer accomplishments we've made in our society and as a people. In this great country we've developed the ability to maneuver our ways through the skies and in the water, and we've since transcended many other boundaries in science and technology that were once limitations. I am glad about the advances we've come to know, and yet the profound reminder from Dr. King that we "have yet to learn the simple act of walking the earth like brothers" is still relevant. These words initially sound very beautiful and hopeful to me, and yet when I look more deeply at how I live, I discover that there is room for me to grow.

You see, my spiritual stretch is not found in my natural and easy relationships with others. It is not found in my relationships with others with whom I share a common ground, a sense of kindred-spiritedness and trust and acceptance. My stretch to "learn the simple act of walking the earth like brothers" becomes evident when I embrace others when my mind would prefer not to.

Sometimes I've chosen to be separate, to hold another outside my heart. Those moments have not been wise on my part, and they've not served me spiritually. They have been times when I've chosen instead to experience the false pleasure of separation between myself and another, when I think I am either above or beneath them. Or sometimes these choices show up when I've made someone "wrong" in my mind. I tell myself that I've been victimized, and I am secretly self-righteous or noble. And if that were not enough, I sometimes have chosen to be separate when I've intentionally ignored gentle opportunities to be inclusive, as if I would somehow lose something special by opening my heart to someone.

So, rather than judge myself for some of my unskillful human choices, I take heart. Dr. King's words and example remind me to begin today and everyday to "learn the simple act of walking the earth like brothers," more fully in my life. In order to do so I'll need to become more aware of myself and change some of my ways of being by:

- ~ allowing others to come first into my heart, and then into my mind, rather than the reverse
- ~ becoming quiet so I can listen to others and open to the possibility of being changed
- ~ giving others the very same respect and love I desire for myself and those dear to me
- ~ honoring my truth and wisdom while I honor others who hold a different truth as wisdom for themselves
- ~ remembering to act out of love and compassion toward my "brothers and sisters" who may live afar and be unknown to me personally
- ~ looking for, finding and celebrating the good and greatness in all that is

I invite you to join me as I walk in oneness with all others more fully. Together let's live the harmony of heaven within us, and we can bring it forth on earth with each other.

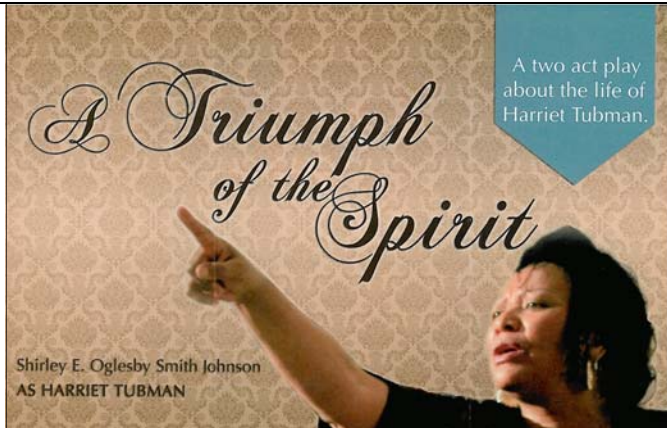

Letter from Your Board of Trustees President, Anita Belmore

In Joy!

Five years ago I had no notion to run for the board of my newly found spiritual center, but within a year, I decided to do so. At the time I was elected to our board, in fact, I was serving on not just one other board, but three, maybe even four or more!

Camille and Jeff Pukay are new first-time parents of a beautiful baby girl named **Amber Lily** born January 9, 2010!



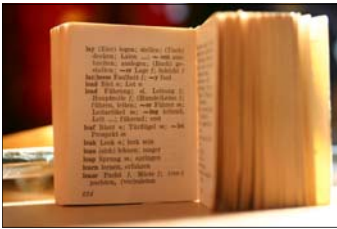
